

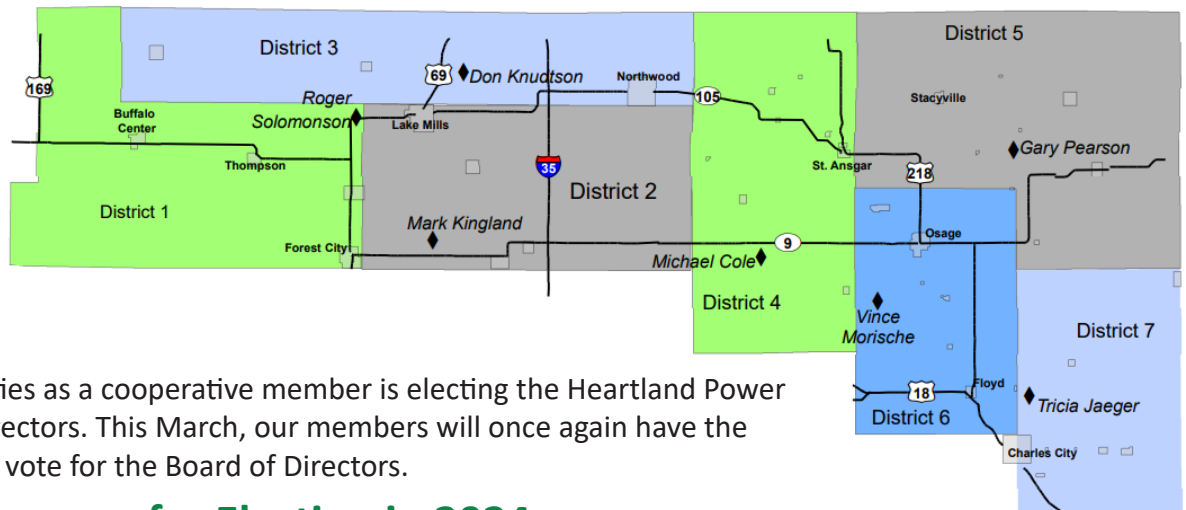

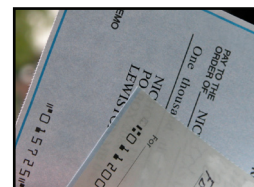

## Director Elections, continued from page 1...

To be considered for election to the Board of Directors, an individual must be a member of Heartland Power Cooperative and listed on the membership card. If only one individual is listed on the membership card, a joint membership may be obtained. In addition to being a member in good standing, the individual must reside and receive electric service from the cooperative at a location within the district in which they are seeking election.

Monthly board meetings usually take place during the day rotating between the offices in St. Ansgar and Thompson. Other board meetings and trainings take place on average of one day per month.

Candidates for election to the Board of Directors are selected by a nominating committee comprised of members who adequately represent the districts up for election. If you are interested, or would like to submit the name of a member who is interested in being considered as a candidate, please contact or send information to one of the nominating committee members or contact our office.

# HPC NOW OFFERS OUTAGE NOTIFICATIONS VIA TEXT

## Register to opt in to our new outage text system!

Imagine you're home on a cold, wintry night. The wind is howling, the snow is blowing, and...the power goes out.

While you can always rest assured that our crews are working to restore power as quickly as possible, we know some questions often remain:

- Is my other property also without power?
- Maybe we should go to a friend's house for the evening?
- If I do leave, how will I know when power is restored?

In the past, it hasn't been possible for us to provide custom outage insights to our members, but thanks to new technologies and our new outage notification system, we are now able to do just that!

**Any member can choose to opt-in to these text message alerts. Upon registering, participating members will be notified of outages at their location(s). They will also receive a message when power has been restored.**

To register, follow the steps indicated in the box to the right. You will need your account number and the phone number(s) that you'd like to have receive the notifications.

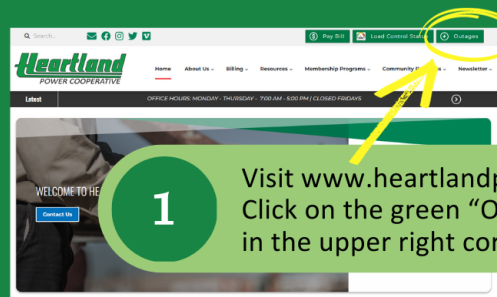
Your account number can be found on your monthly billing statement. If you have questions or need assistance setting up the outage notifications, please contact our office at 641-584-2251.

We're excited to roll out this new program as yet another tool to help keep our cooperative members safe and informed.



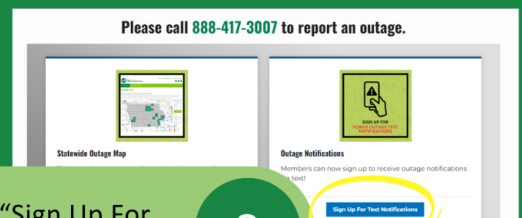

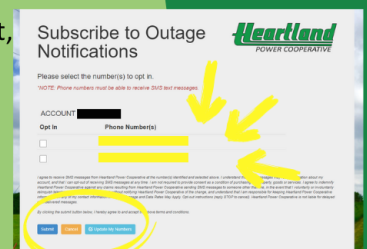
Click on the "Sign Up For Text Notifications" button.

**White Bark Rice Krispies**

Melt:

- 1 1/2 pound white bark (20 oz. pkg works)

# Disconnected Service/Idle Service Policy



Services may be temporarily disconnected at a member's request, however if the member requests the service be reconnected within the next 15 months, they will be charged the minimum bill service charge for the months the service was disconnected and a \$60 reconnect fee. Services that are not connected at the end of the calendar year will be notified as they must pay a \$48 fee to have Heartland Power maintain the service in a state of readiness for the next calendar year. If the service is reconnected during the year, the member will receive a \$4 credit on their bill for each month that service is active for the year.

If the member elects not to pay the idle service charge, Heartland Power may remove the service at any time. Once the service line has been removed, removal costs and construction costs to rebuild the service line may be charged to the member to reinstall the service. Please contact us if you have any questions regarding this policy.

They are committed to making sure there is safe, reliable and affordable electricity available when member-consumers flip the switch to power their lives every day.

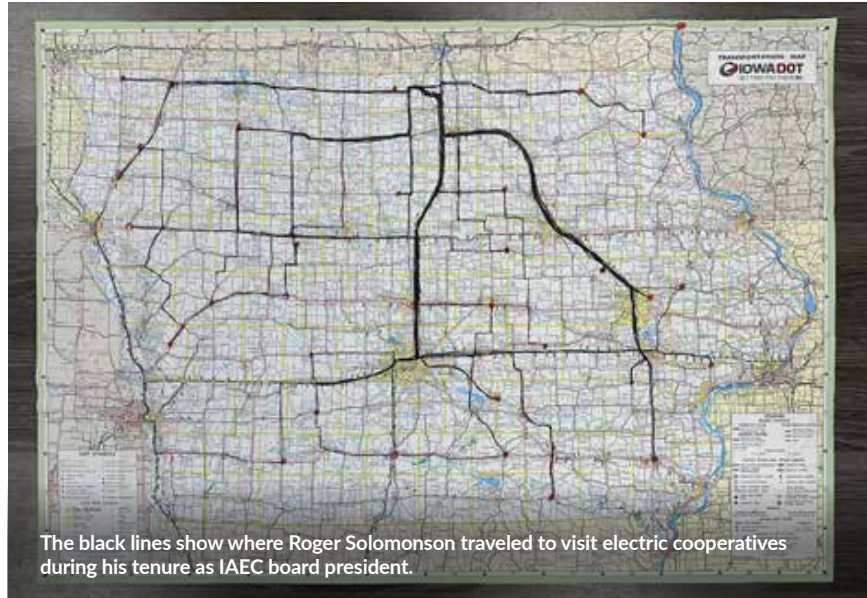
## Raising our collective voice

Another high point was attending statewide legislative fly-ins to Washington, D.C., to speak with our elected officials along with industry lobbyists and experts in various fields. Watching our national government work (or sometimes not work) is always interesting.

I also often traveled to Des Moines during the Iowa legislative sessions to meet with state legislators to advocate for the members of rural electric cooperatives and to make sure electric cooperative voices were heard. As it was told to me, the rural electric movement was started by politics and may someday die in politics if we aren't active and vocal.

## Iowa nice, regional connections

In September, the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association held a regional meeting in Des Moines for attendees from six Midwestern states. We spent time learning from experts in several fields and receiving national updates. I also had the pleasure of meeting with other statewide board presidents to discuss mutual goals. I heard several comments about how friendly and clean Des Moines is, to which I shared we're all about "Iowa nice" and encouraged them to come back soon.
